I would recommend continuing with recommendations we have made there in the past:

- 1) add brush piles for cover; best in water depth up to 8 ft deep, from shoreline out to that depth.
- 2) continue slot limit on the bass population: fishermen may keep 2 bass: 1 under 12 inches, and 1 fish 18 inches or larger. This special management permit was issued 10/9/2006, continue to posted regulation around the lake.
- 3) Gizzard shad is the primary forage in the lake. This means that you will need to manage the lake for predators (largemouth bass and channel catfish). The presence of shad makes managing bluegill and crappie very hard. However, your population of bluegill is not very bad for a lake with gizzard shad. Sorry for the delay in my response, let me know if you have further questions.
